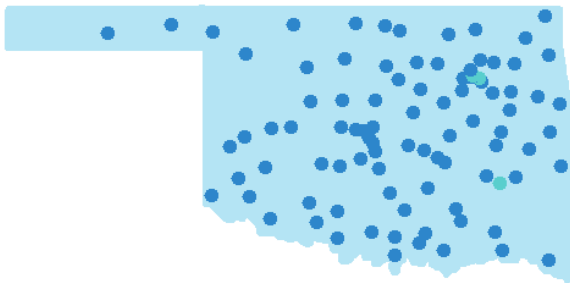

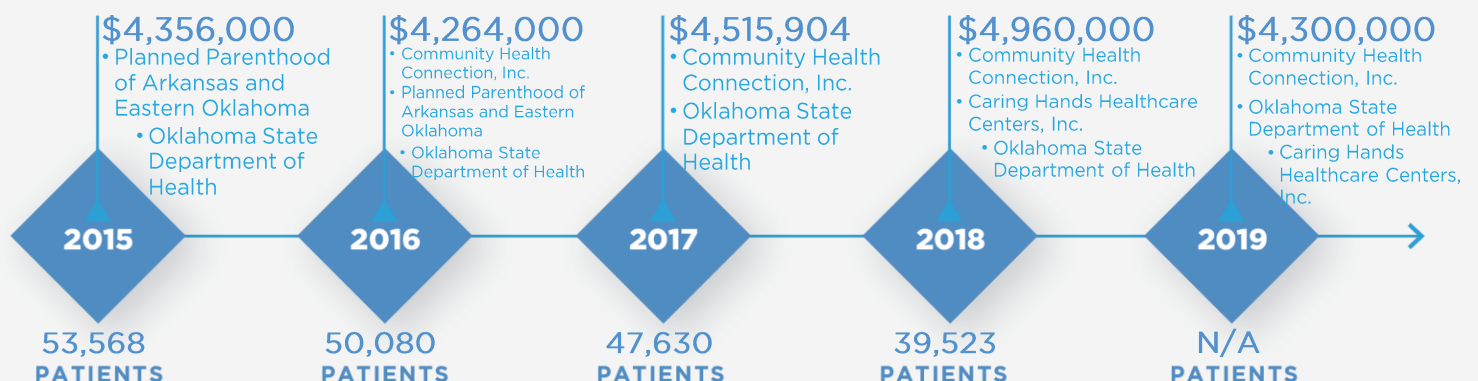
WOMEN OF REPRODUCTIVE AGE WITH

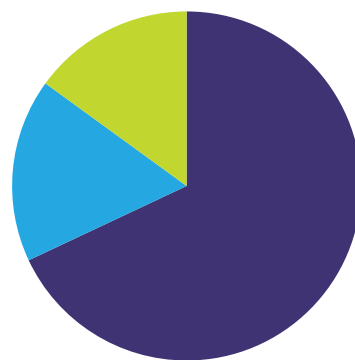
