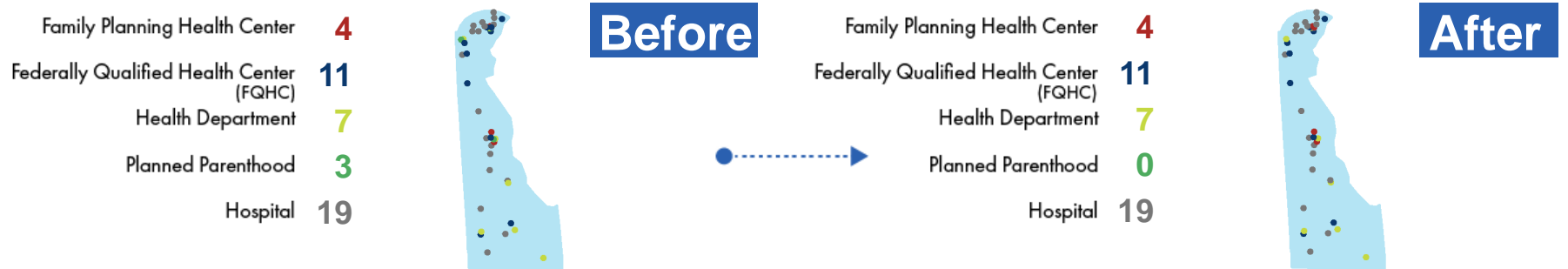


IMPACT OF THE TITLE X RULE IN Delaware

Delaware Health and Social Services is the Title X (ten) grantee in Delaware. Across the country, the diverse network of health centers supported by Title X provides a range of essential preventive health services, including breast and cervical cancer detection, screening and treatment for sexually transmitted diseases, HIV testing, and contraception, for thousands of low-income, uninsured, and underinsured individuals and families each year who would otherwise lack access to care.

Despite decades of improving public health outcomes achieved through funding patient-centered, high-quality care, the Trump administration issued regulations in March 2019 that undercut the hallmarks of the program and drove out a number of longstanding, trusted providers. As a result, administrators, providers, and patients in Delaware have been left to adjust to challenging circumstances.

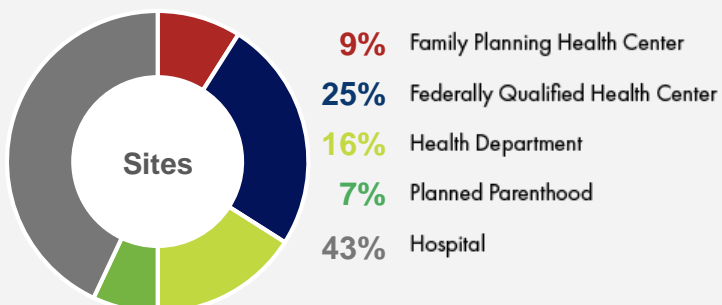
RULE'S EFFECT ON PROVIDER NETWORK



Health center participation naturally shifts throughout program grant cycles. The maps above reflect the totality of change in Delaware's provider network from July 2019 to December 2019, not exclusively shifts as a result of the Title X rule. Where possible, grantees are working to fill gaps left by service sites' departures from the program.

The following chart shows the site distribution for participating providers in 2019 (before the rule).

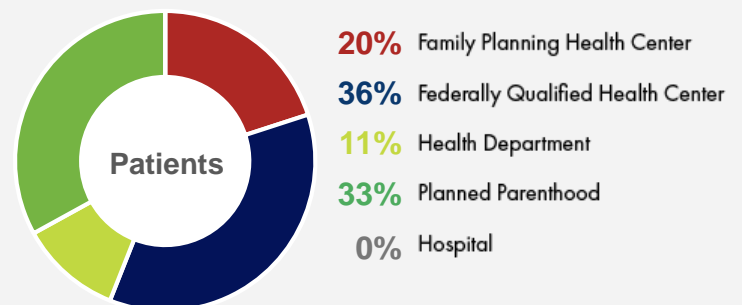


Entities that represent less than 0.5% of the network are listed as 0%.

Entities that represent less than 0.5% of the network are listed as 0%.

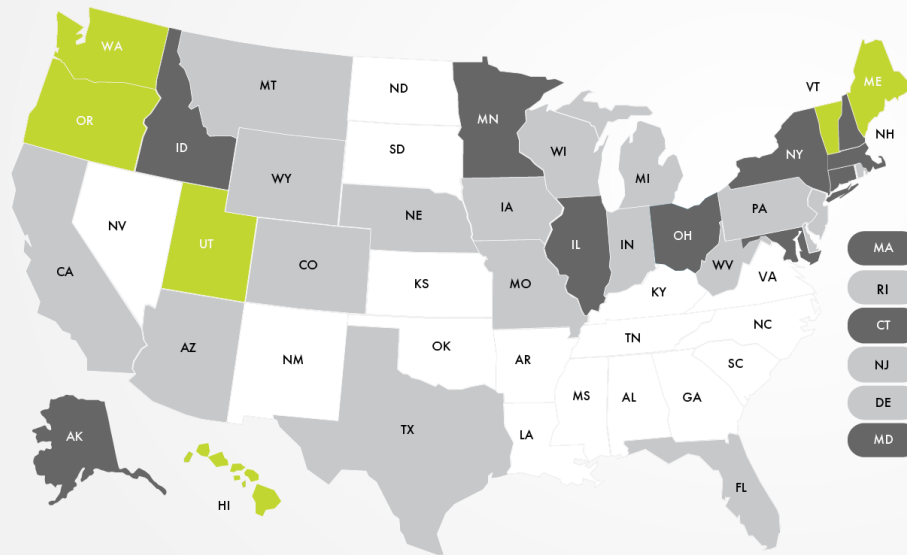

5 THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT THE TITLE X RULE



Patients will no longer be guaranteed nondirective counseling on all of their pregnancy options.



Referral for abortion care is prohibited –even when a patient specifically asks for a referral.



Patients' wishes and medical professionals' knowledge are both disregarded.



Non-medical providers with religious and moral objections to providing core family planning care are encouraged to participate.



The provider-patient relationship is undermined.
