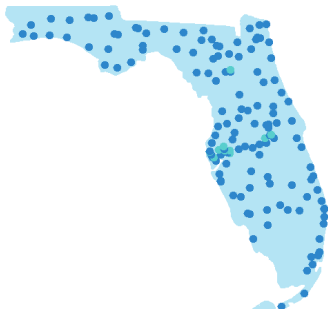

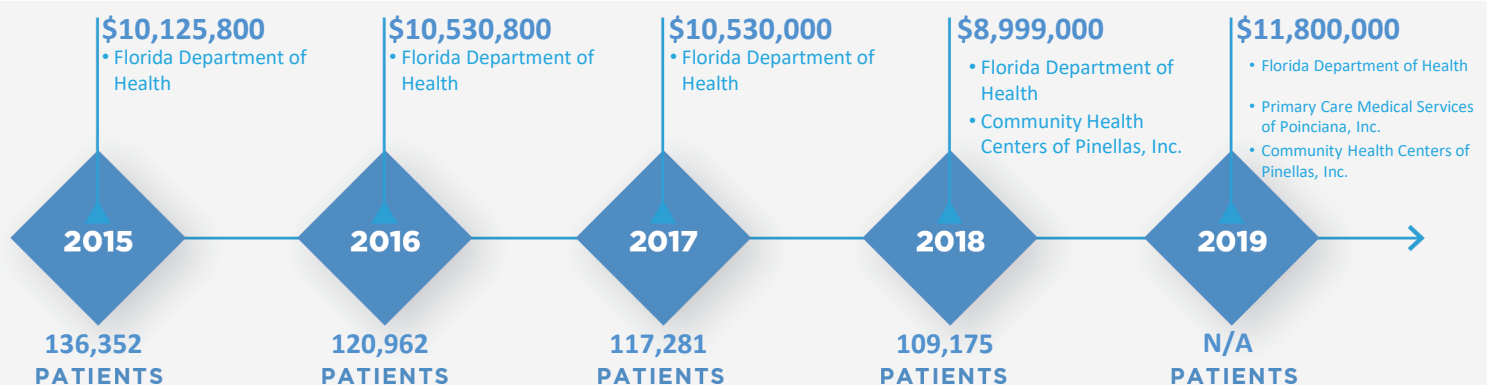
WOMEN OF REPRODUCTIVE AGE WITH HOUSEHOLD INCOMES AT/BELOW 250% FPL

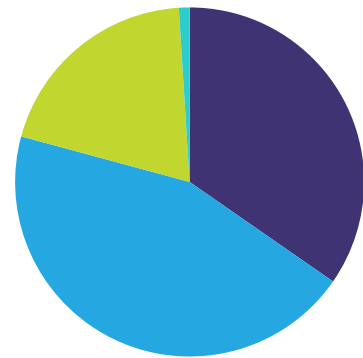
