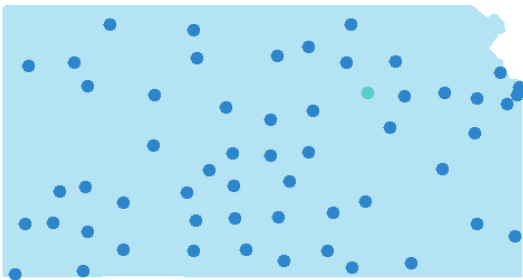

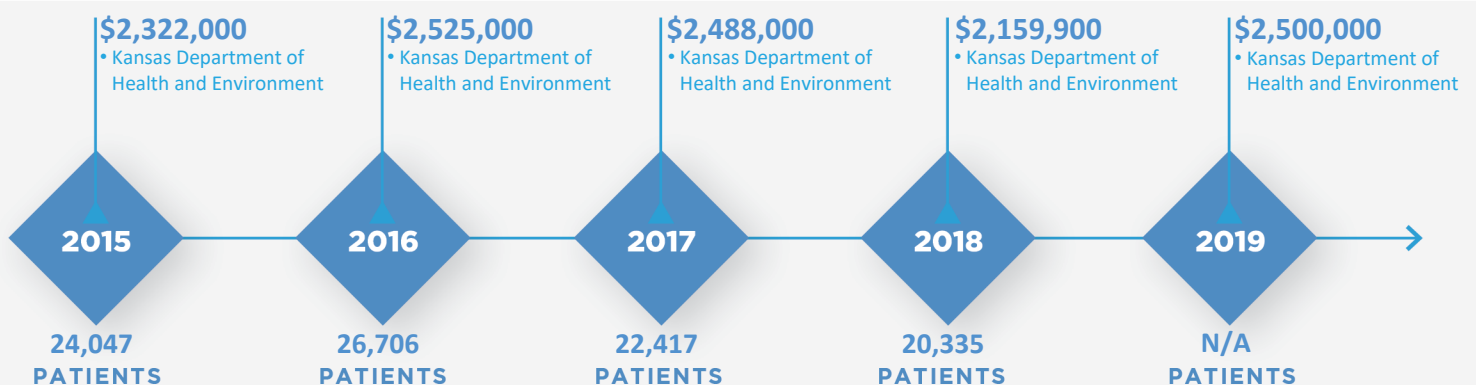
WOMEN OF REPRODUCTIVE AGE WITH HOUSEHOLD INCOMES AT/BELOW 250% FPL

Office of Population of Affairs only collects binary sex data.

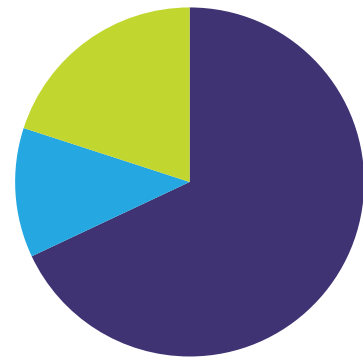
