# The Impact of Title X Funding Cuts in ALASKA







Title X-funded health centers helped women avoid one million unintended pregnancies in 2013, which prevented 501,000 unplanned births and 345,000 abortions.

Despite these positive health impacts, federal funding for Title X has shrunk, and now fewer low-income and uninsured people across the country, and in Alaska, are able to access family planning and sexual health services funded by Title X.

## **CONSEQUENCES OF FUNDING LOSSES**







The grantees have identified at least three areas in the state with the highest need; however, due to funding cuts, they have had insufficient resources to attract and establish contracts with service providers in the areas. Additionally, existing service providers have received fewer funds for purchasing contraceptives.
