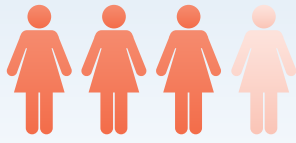


# Americans support publicly funded family planning.



**3** out of **4** women believe publicly funded family planning is **essential**.

In 2014, **64%** of Title X patients reported using a highly or moderately effective method of contraception.

In 2014, Title X service sites provided:

- ✓ **785,540** Pap tests
- ✓ **1.3 million** clinical breast exams
- ✓ **1.8 million** chlamydia tests
- ✓ **1 million** confidential HIV tests.

## Title X-funded Care: Critical Access Point for Poor and Low-income Individuals

Federal Poverty Level (FPL)

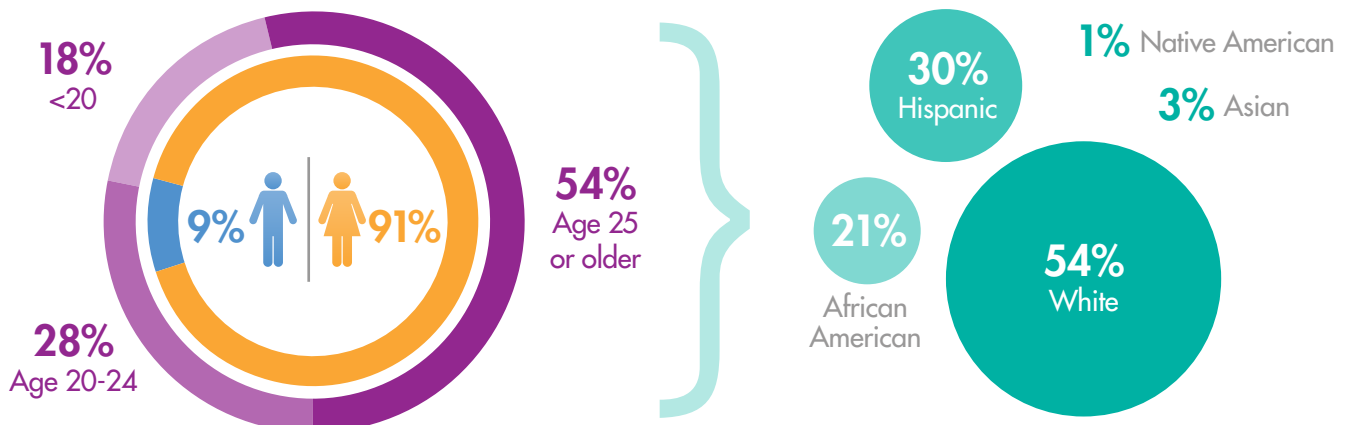
**\$11,670**

**69%** of all patients had incomes below the FPL, and receive care at no cost.

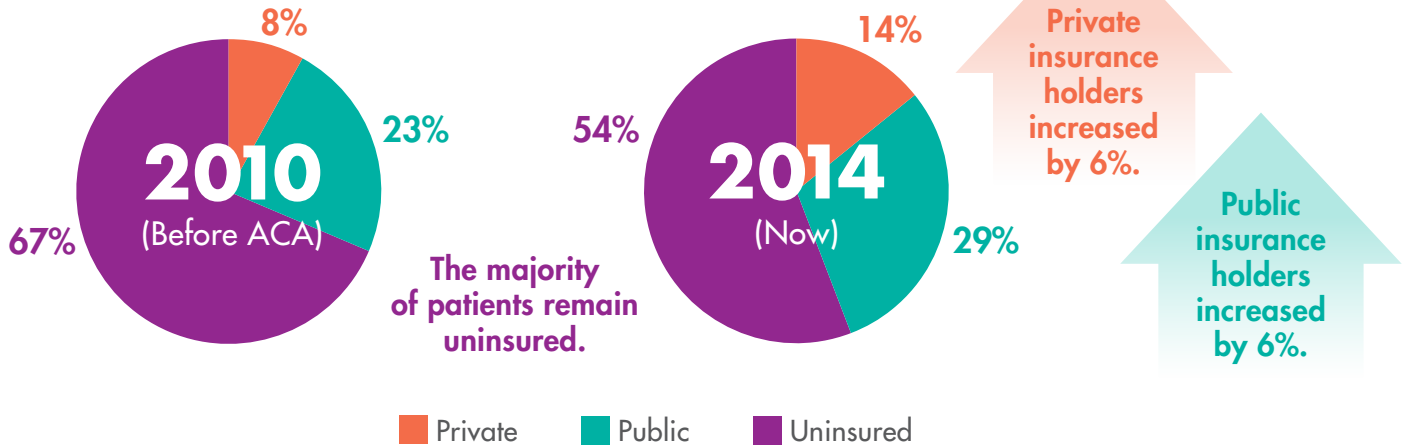
**22%** of patients had incomes between 101–250% of the FPL, and receive care at reduced cost.

Title X Cares for Women and Men of all Ages, Races and Ethnicities\*



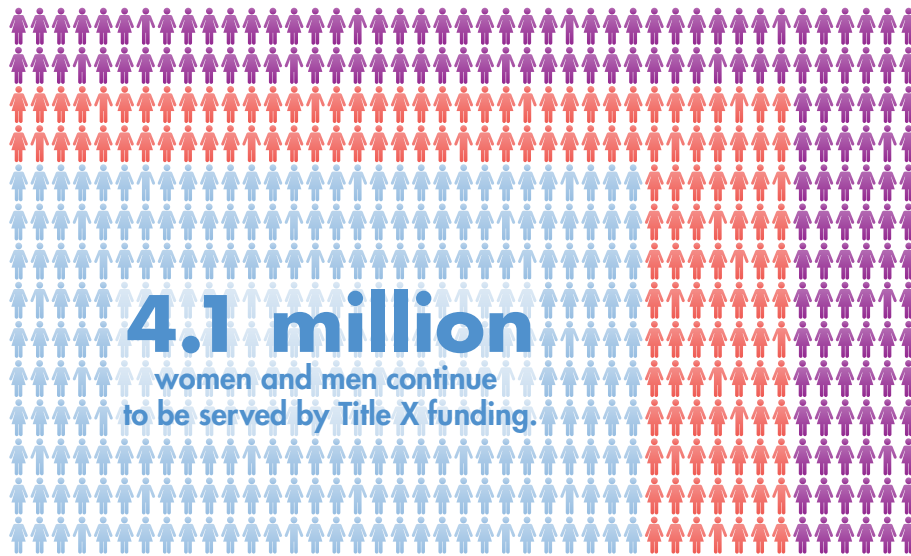
**Title X remains crucial,

**Since 2010, Congress has cut the Title X budget by 10% or \$40 million. Meanwhile, patient demand continually increases.**
