

NFPRHA Health and Safety Attendee Guidelines

Winter 2024 Seasonal Meeting

NFPRHA's top priority is the health and safety of our event attendees. Our goal is to hold a safe event, recognizing it is not possible to prevent exposure to all environmental risks, and in particular, COVID transmission.

People with disabilities and people who are immunocompromised have been left behind in the federal, state, and local response to COVID and ongoing health and safety measures. NFPRHA is working to ensure that all attendees feel safe regardless of their health status and has put measures in place to provide a safe and inclusive environment for our event attendees.

To participate in NFPRHA's winter 2024 seasonal meeting, attendees will be required to:

- **When completing the online meeting registration, attest that they have either:**
 - **received COVID vaccination(s), or**
 - **if they have not received COVID vaccination(s), will both self-administer an at-home COVID antigen test and receive a negative result within 72 hours of traveling to Newport Beach, CA for the seasonal meeting.**

- **After arriving onsite at the Newport Beach hotel and prior to checking in at NFPRHA registration, take a COVID rapid antigen test with NFPRHA's designated vendor that will be administering the tests.**
 - **Attendees must receive a negative result onsite to participate in the meeting.**

In addition, NFPRHA recommends, but is not requiring, that meeting attendees:

- Wear masks while indoors in the meeting space.

- Take an at-home COVID test and receive a negative result prior to traveling, regardless of vaccination status.

Attendees will be expected to take common actions to reduce the risk of COVID transmission and to behave responsibly (including leaving the event area) in case of exposure to a COVID case or experiencing symptoms. In such case, attendees should seek appropriate medical attention, including a COVID test, and must immediately inform NFPRHA staff should a COVID test be positive during the event or in the 14 days following the event.
