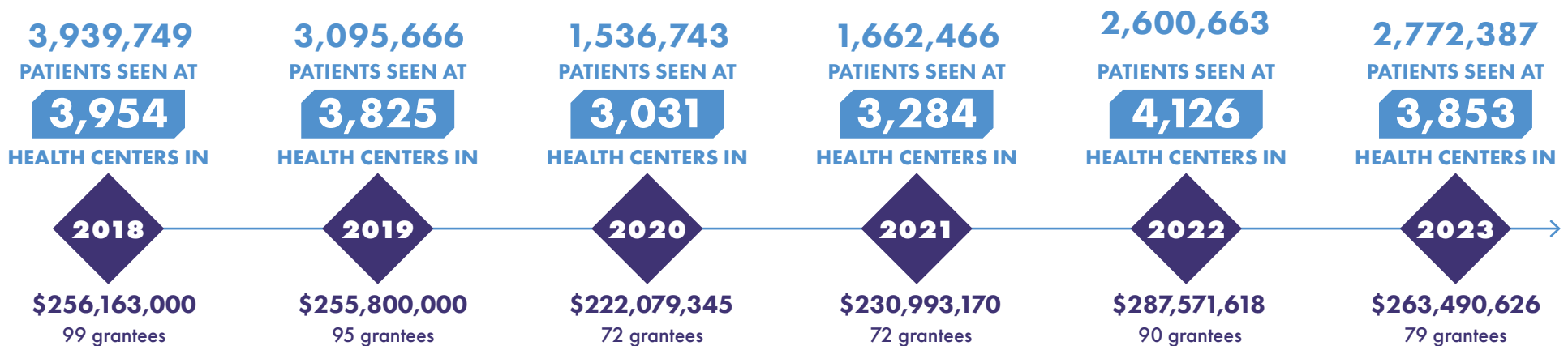

This mission has been threatened by years of insufficient funding and politically motivated attacks, leaving millions without access to federally supported services.

While there have been shifts in the proportion of funds allocated to Title X service grants over this time period, funding for the program as a whole has remained stagnant for a decade. Title X was further impacted by the first Trump administration's devastating program rule, in effect from July 2019 – November 2021, and the COVID-19 pandemic.

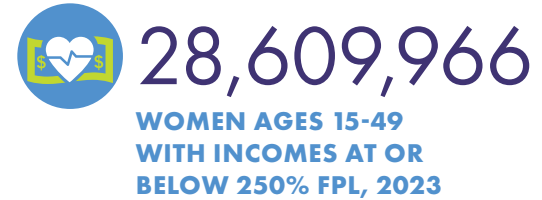

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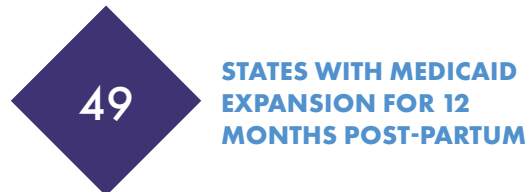

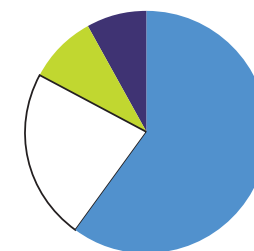

STATE MEDICAID EXPANSIONS, 2024*

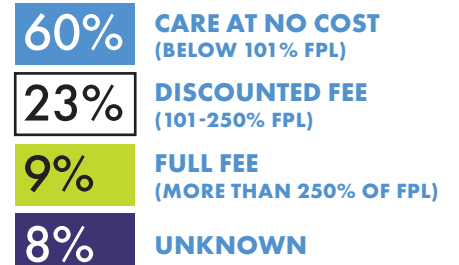

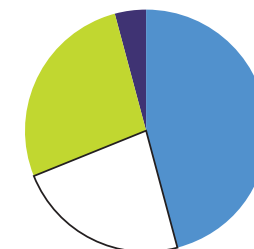
TITLE X PATIENTS 2023
