Data Notes

- Unless noted otherwise, data reflect information that was publicly available as of November 2023.
- National data includes as many parts of the United States as possible, but some sources only count people living in the 50 states and the District of Columbia.
- The Title X network experienced a seismic shift in 2019 when the Trump administration's 2019 program rule went into effect. More than 1,000 service sites left the program at that time. Most grantees were not able to rebuild their networks or rejoin the program until 2022, and sometimes only partway through that year.
- Cases of congenital syphilis are given per 100,000 live births. As congenital syphilis frequently leads to miscarriage or stillbirth, it is likely these numbers are a significant undercount.
