

Title X-funded health centers helped women avoid one million unintended pregnancies in 2013, which prevented 501,000 unplanned births and 345,000 abortions.


Despite these positive health impacts, federal funding for Title X has shrunk, and now fewer low-income and uninsured people across the country, and in Tennessee, are able to access family planning and sexual health services funded by Title X.

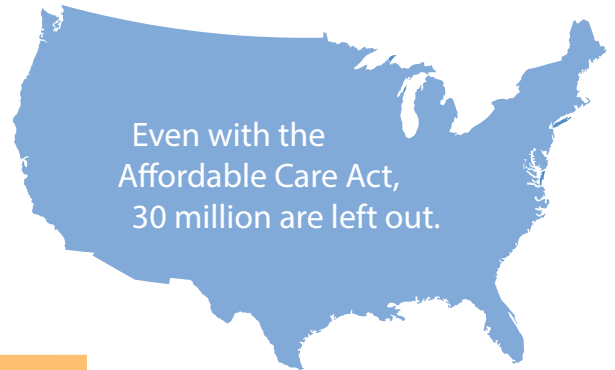
WHY TITLE X MATTERS

In 2009, the state legislature passed a law that gave full authority to decide how Title X funds can be distributed to county health departments. By the end of 2011, all 95 counties in the state had pulled their funds from Planned Parenthood health centers, and in some instances, diverted them to organizations that refused to provide emergency contraception or refer for abortion services. Recognizing the growing need for family planning services across the state, despite shrinking resources, the federal government awarded a separate Title X grant to Planned Parenthood Greater Memphis Region in 2012, bringing more Title X dollars into the state. This development likely had a significant impact on the number of patients seeking care from Title X health centers.



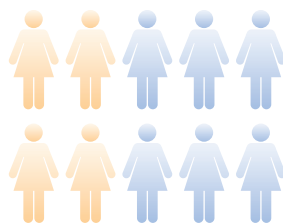
