## **TEXAS**

Title X-funded health centers helped women avoid one million unintended pregnancies in 2013, which prevented 501,000 unplanned births and 345,000 abortions.

Despite these positive health impacts federal funding for Title X has shrunk, and now fewer low-income and uninsured people across the country, and in Texas, are able to access family planning and sexual health services funded by Title X.

State family planning funds were cut by two-thirds in 2011. The remaining funds were distributed through a three-level tiering system that prioritized funding first for health departments, then federally qualified health centers, and finally standalone family planning centers.

At the same time, the state began excluding abortion providers from receiving funds through its Medicaid family planning expansion. The restriction ultimately ended a state/federal partnership that provided family planning services through a Medicaid family planning waiver and left many women and men with nowhere to go for family planning services.
