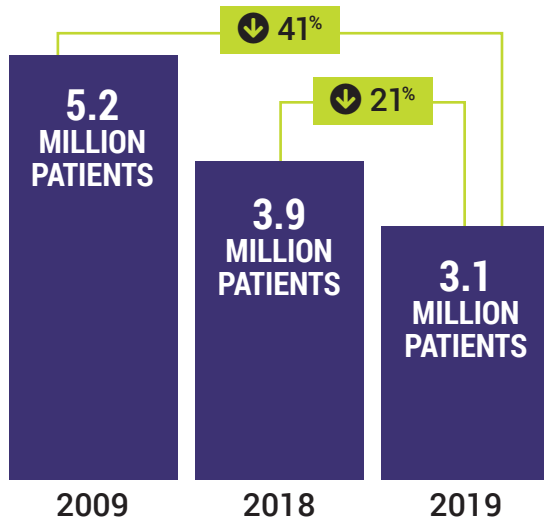
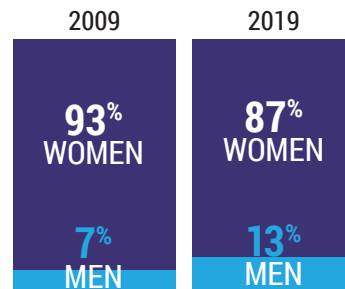
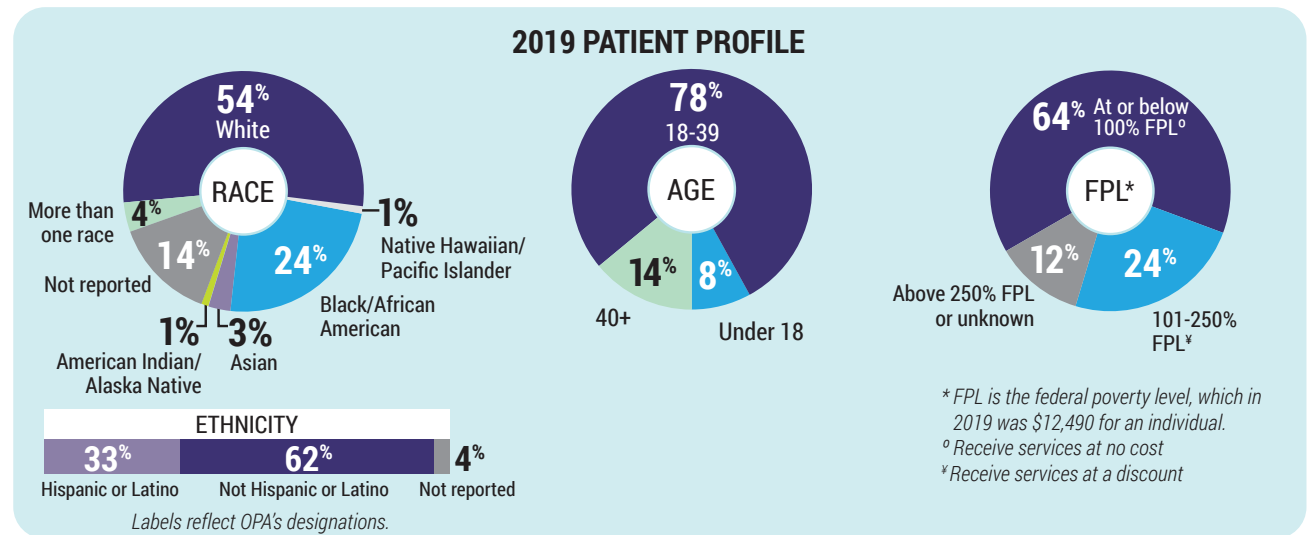


Family Planning Annual Report 2019 – Key Data

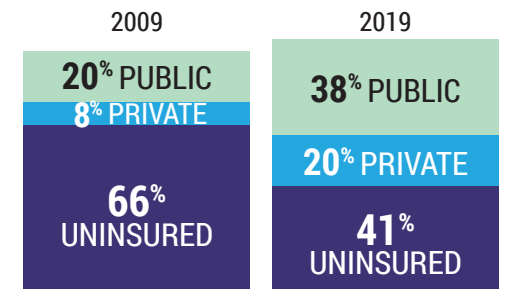
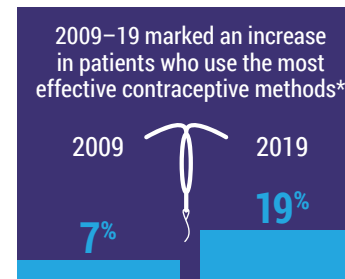
Stagnant funding and harmful, ideological restrictions imposed by the Trump administration in 2019 have led to a dramatic decline in the total number of people receiving Title-X supported services despite the sustained efforts of highly qualified administrators and providers.



Title X is a critical source of health care for all people – especially women of color, people with low incomes, and the uninsured



The Office of Population Affairs only collects binary sex data.



Numbers do not add to 100% because some patients' insurance status is unknown.



FY2021 is the **8th year** in a row that Congress is expected to fund Title X without an increase.



39 states (including DC) have expanded Medicaid eligibility under the Affordable Care Act. Title X-funded health centers are critical access points for Medicaid enrollees.



The unlawful Title X rule has prompted **family planning providers in more than 30 states to leave the program.**
