


THE TITLE X FAMILY PLANNING PROGRAM IN Ohio

As of September 1, 2018, the Office of Population Affairs (OPA) provided Title X service delivery grants to the Ohio Department of Health, Planned Parenthood of Greater Ohio, and Planned Parenthood of Southwest Ohio Region to support access to family planning and sexual health services in Ohio. The diverse network of health centers supported by Title X provides a range of essential preventive health services, including breast and cervical cancer detection, screening and treatment for sexually transmitted diseases, HIV testing, and contraception, for thousands of low-income, uninsured, and underinsured individuals and families each year who would otherwise lack access to care.

Despite this important mission, federal funding for Title X has shrunk in recent years, and now fewer low-income and uninsured people in Ohio are able to access family planning and sexual health services funded by Title X.



