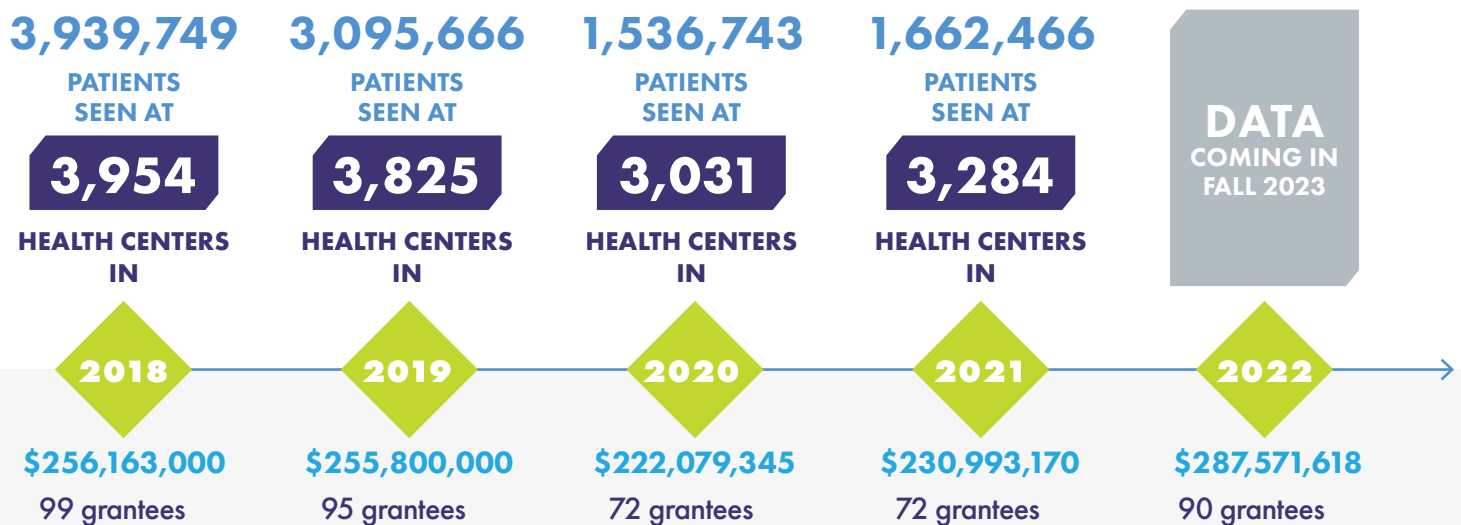

## TITLE X PATIENTS BY SEX

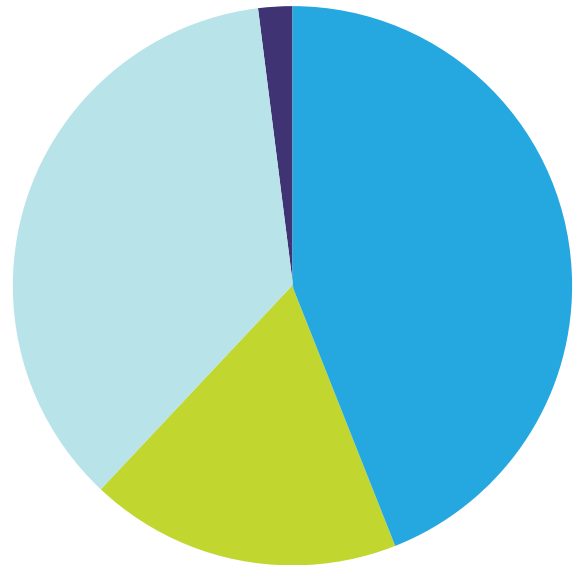

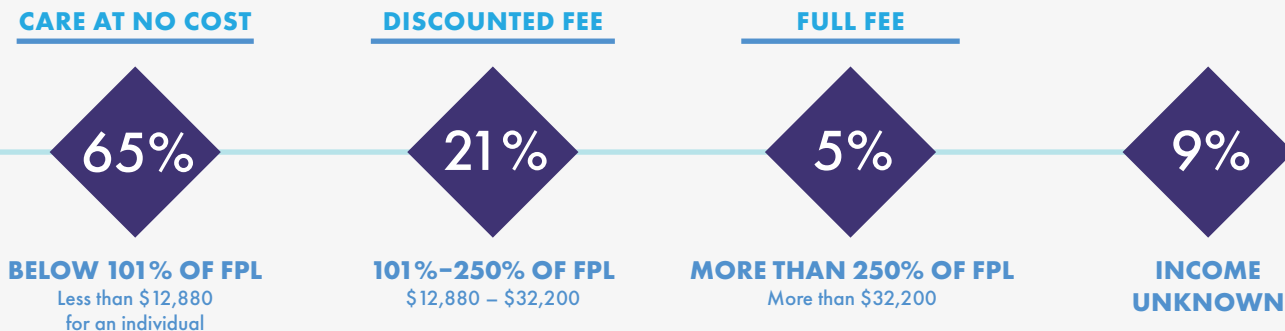
