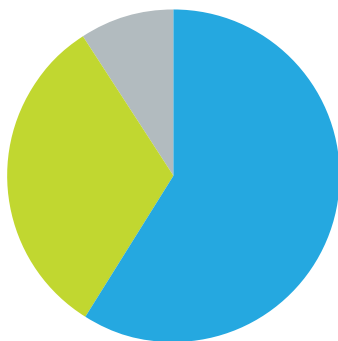

Income is listed relative to the federal poverty level (FPL). In 2022, the FPL for an individual was \$13,590.

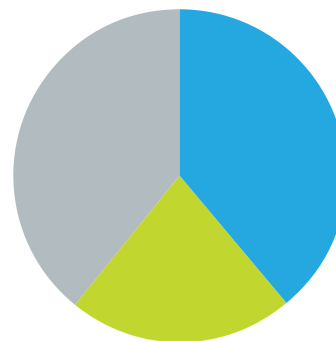

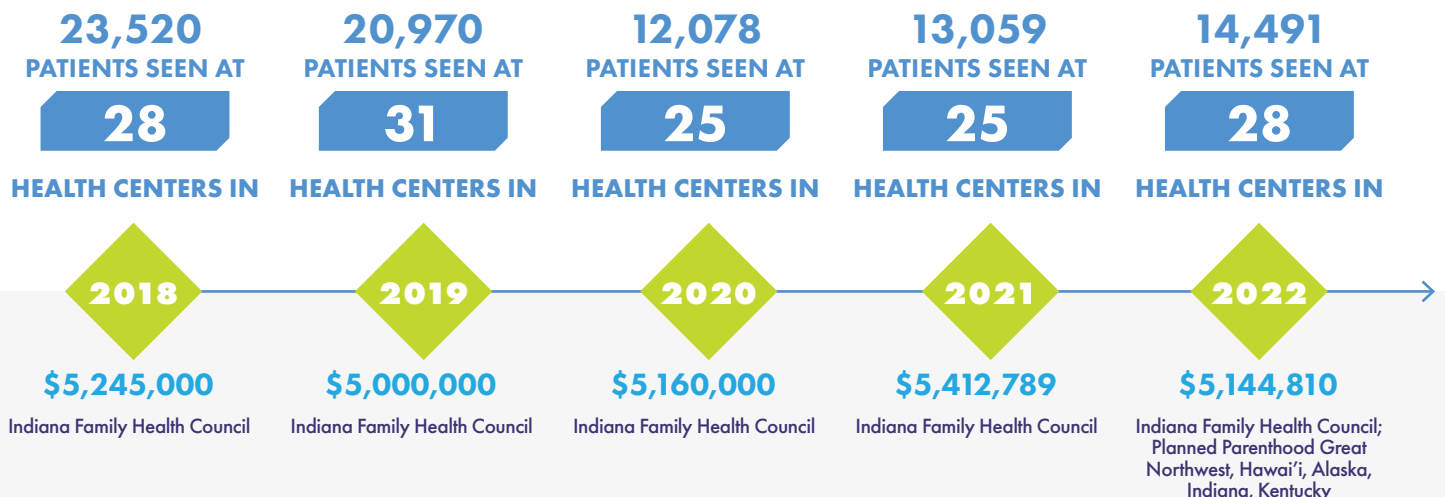

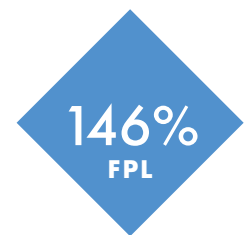
